SYRINGE DRIVER COMPETENCY

COST: \$50 + GST

Registered Nurses

Enrolled Nurses can complete the course but must work within their scope of practice (as defined by the Nursing Council of NZ).

The Syringe Driver Competency Programme is a nationally recognised programme developed by Hospice New Zealand to support registered and enrolled nurses to gain proficiency in the set up and management of the syringe driver, covering both theoretical and practical skills in the handling of the driver and relevant medications.

It is a blended learning programme consisting of eLearning modules and a practical assessment workshop delivered by the Hospice West Auckland Education Team.

The programme covers:

- The use of a syringe drivers in palliative care
- Educating patients and families about the use of a syringe driver
- Medications commonly used in syringe drivers in palliative care and the rationale for their use
- · Medication calculations
- Setting up an infusion using the Niki T34 syringe driver
- · Management and safety principles when caring for patients with these devices


FUNDAMENTALS OF PALLIATIVE CARE

The Fundamentals of Palliative Care programme is a Hospice New Zealand endorsed programme designed for any healthcare worker, registered and non-registered staff caring for people with a palliative care need.

Being educated about palliative care will help you improve the assessment and outcomes for people in your care, their family and whanau, as well as yourself and other healthcare workers.



This is a blended learning programme of eLearning and workshop training. The 4 eLearning modules must be completed prior to attending the workshop.

Upon completing your eLearning, you will attend a full day in person workshop from 8.30am - 4.00pm followed by a 90 min Zoom the following morning.
